

REGULATIONS

Dr.G.U.Pope College of Education follows the norms, standards and curricular transactions prescribed by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE).

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA INTO B.Ed. COURSE:

A candidate with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor's Degree (B.A/B.Sc., with 10+2+3 pattern) and/or in the Master's Degree (M.A/M.Sc/M.Com/MCA Integrated) of this University or any other qualification equivalent thereto of any recognized university approved by the Board of Management (BOM) of Dr.G.U.PCOE.

The reservation for SC/ST/OBC and other communities shall be as per the rules of the Central government/State Government whichever is applicable. There shall be relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC/ST/OBC and other categories of candidates.

Resolution: It is proposed to adopt the changes made in the norms and standards recently by the NCTE with regards to the number of working days, eligibility criteria (minimum 50% in the group subjects for general category, 45% for BC & OBC 43% for MBC, minimum pass for SC & ST candidates). However 5% of the seats shall be reserved for special categories which include Sports & Games, NCC, NSS, First-Aid and Disaster Management etc., and minimum pass in the qualifying degree is the eligibility for B.Ed course to all the candidates of the above categories. When more than five candidates are available candidates with more percentage will be given the preference.

A candidate will be admitted to the B.Ed Course only by the production of satisfactory evidence of passing the requisite examinations with required percentage of marks.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

The course of study shall last for one academic year. The dates of examinations will be intimated to the students beforehand. The B.Ed degree examination will be held once in a year at the school of education of PCOE

ADMISSION AND ATTENDANCE

1. Admission into the course shall be made on merit on the basis of the marks obtained in the qualifying examination and/or the entrance examination conducted by the School of education of PCOE
2. 80 % of Attendance at theory papers is compulsory for each paper.
3. 10% of attendance can be condoned on certified ill – health.
4. 100% attendance is compulsory at practice teaching and internship.
5. The student teachers who absent themselves for a continuous period of 10 lectures in two courses is served with a show cause notice by the Head, why not his/her admission into B.Ed., course be cancelled and act accordingly.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR:

Educational tour for a minimum period of two days is mandatory for the student teachers and must submit the details of the tour in the prescribed record.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

The activities of Physical Education are compulsory for all the students of B.Ed both Men and Women.

UNIFORM:

There is a prescribed uniform for both men and women of the PCOE. The uniform for male student teachers is Blue colour shirt and Black colour trousers and for female student teachers blue colour saree with blue colour blouse.

Wearing of Uniform is mandatory in the following occasions.

1. During the time of Teaching practice, Demonstration lessons and Observation lessons.
2. During the periods of Physical Education.
3. On all days except on Friday
4. During the time of rallies, processions etc
5. During the time of celebration of National festivals
6. During the time of other special occasions.

CITIZENSHIP TRAINING CAMP:

It is compulsory for all the students to participate in the **three –day** CT Camp and must submit the report of the CT camp at the end

OTHER ITEMS TO BE TAKEN CARE OF:

- The teaching of the theory must be for 100 lecture hours
- If a teacher happens to be on leave during the period, he/she has to take additional periods and complete the syllabus. He must not reduce and complete the syllabus in available periods.
- If any day (instruction) happens to be a disturbed, other holiday is to be treated as instructional day.
- Every teacher has to maintain the work done, syllabus completion record every day / month.
- Work taken up during the month is to be displayed in the lecture halls by concerned lecturers
